The teacher participants shall be entitled to service credits, while non-teaching and teaching-related personnel involved in this training shall be entitled to compensatory time-off during the holidays/weekends in accordance with item no. 4.11 of Department Order No. 53, s. of 2003 re: Updated Guidelines on the Grant of Service Credits to teachers as amended by DO No. 84, s. 2003 and DO No. 13, s. 2024 titled Revised Guidelines on the Grant of Vacation Service Credits for Teachers and Regional Memorandum No. 140, s. 2025 and upon compliance of the required documentary requirements.
6. Travel expenses incurred by the identified participants and teacher-advisers in this activity shall be chargeable to School MOOE/Local Funds, while accommodation, meals, and snacks shall be covered by the City Population Office – Sagay City subject to usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.




