1. 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CRITERIA FOR JUDGING

Tech-Voc Traditional Poster Making Contest

Theme: " *Beyond the Classroom: Tech-Voc for a Thriving Community*"

Mechanics:

1. **Participants**
 - a. Each school shall have **one (1)** official representative.
 - b. Participants must be **bona fide students** of the Division of Sagay City.
 - c. Two (2) categories: **Elementary** and **High School**.
2. **Artwork Content**
 - a. The poster must be **original** and aligned with the **National Tech-Voc 2025 theme**.
 - b. It should highlight the importance of technical and vocational education in providing skills and opportunities for employment and a brighter future.
3. **Materials**
 - a. The standard size of the poster is **¼ illustration board** (white).
 - b. Participants must bring their own art materials (e.g., pencils, pens, markers, crayons, colored pencils, watercolors, or paints).
 - c. No printed or pre-made images, stencils, or computer-generated materials are allowed.
4. **On-the-Spot Contest Rules**
 - a. The poster must be made **on the spot** during the contest period.
 - b. Contest time: **8:00 AM – 11:00 AM** (3 hours).
 - c. Judging will be from **11:00 AM – 12:00 NN**.
5. **Originality Requirement**
 - a. Entries must be the sole work of the participant.
 - b. Copying from existing posters or tracing will result in **disqualification**.
6. **Ownership of Entries**
 - a. All submitted entries will become the property of the Schools Division and may be used for **advocacy or promotional purposes**.
7. **Criteria for Judging:**

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Tech-Voc Digital Poster Making Contest

Theme: *"Beyond the Classroom: Tech-Voc for a Thriving Community"*

Mechanics

1. Participants

- a. Each school shall have **one (1)** official representative.
- b. Participants must be **bona fide students** of the Division of Sagay City.
- c. Two (2) categories: **Elementary** and **High School**.

2. Artwork Content

- a. Each participant must create an **original digital poster** aligned with the **National Tech-Voc 2025 theme**.
- b. The poster should highlight the role of technical and vocational education in equipping Filipinos with skills and opportunities for employment and a brighter future.

3. Tools and Materials

- o Participants may bring their own gadgets (laptop, tablet, or smartphone).
- o Any **digital art software** may be used (e.g., Photoshop, Canva, Procreate).

4. File Format & Submission

- o Entries must be saved and submitted in **JPEG or PNG** format.
- o File naming format:

5. Time Allotment

- o Poster creation: **8:00 AM – 11:00 AM** (3 hours).
- o Judging: **11:00 AM – 12:00 NN**.

6. Originality Requirement

- o The artwork must be **completely original**.
- o Use of templates, copyrighted images, or **AI-generated content without substantial modification** will result in disqualification.

7. Ownership of Entries

- o All submitted entries will become the property of the Schools Division and may be used for **advocacy or promotional purposes**.

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Tech-Voc Plant Stand Making Contest

Theme: " *Beyond the Classroom: Tech-Voc for a Thriving Community* "

Mechanics

1. **Participants**
 - o Each participating school may send **one (1) team** composed of **3 bona fide students** enrolled in TLE/TVL Specialization in SMAW.
 - o Participants must be officially endorsed by their school head.
2. **Project Specifications**
 - o Participants must fabricate a **plant stand** using SMAW (Shielded Metal Arc Welding) techniques.
 - o The plant stand design must be functional, stable, and safe for use.
 - o Dimensions: **Maximum height – 1 meter, Maximum width – 0.6 meters.**
 - o Materials to be used must be mild steel (angle bar, flat bar, round bar, or plate).
3. **Materials & Tools**
 - o Basic materials (steel bars, plates, electrodes) will be brought by the participants.
 - o Teams may bring their own hand tools, measuring tools, clamps, and welding PPE.
 - o The use of electric cutting and grinding tools is allowed.
4. **Time Allotment**
 - o Fabrication period: **3 hours** (8:00 AM – 11:00 AM).
 - o Judging and display: **11:00 AM – 12:00 PM.**
5. **On-the-Spot Work Requirement**
 - o All cutting, fitting, welding, and assembly must be done on-site during the competition period.
 - o Prefabricated parts, pre-cut steel, or pre-assembled components will not be allowed.
6. **Safety Compliance**
 - o Participants must wear **complete PPE**: welding helmet, gloves, apron, long sleeves, and safety shoes.
 - o Unsafe practices may result in point deduction or disqualification.
7. **Originality & Functionality**
 - o The design must be original and not copied from a commercially available product.
 - o The finished plant stand must be able to support the weight of an actual potted plant.
8. **Ownership of Output**
 - o All fabricated plant stands will become the property of the organizer for display, advocacy, or promotional purposes.

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Tech-Voc On-the-spot Electrical Installation Making Contest

Theme: " *Beyond the Classroom: Tech-Voc for a Thriving Community*"

Mechanics

1. **Participants**
 - o Each school may send **one (1) team of two (2)** bona fide junior or senior high school students enrolled in the TVL track with an EIM specialization.
 - o Participants must be officially endorsed by their school head.
2. **Competition Scope**
 - o The task will involve **on-the-spot electrical installation** based on a given wiring plan or layout.
 - o Installation may include **lighting circuits, convenience outlets, switches, and panel boards** according to the instructions provided during the contest briefing.
3. **Materials & Tools**
 - o Basic electrical materials (wires, outlets, switches, breakers, panel board, mounting boards) will be provided by the organizers.
 - o Participants may bring their own hand tools and PPE (insulated pliers, screwdrivers, tester, measuring tools, etc.).
 - o The use of **power tools** will be allowed only if specified by the organizers.
4. **Time Allotment**
 - o **Preparation & Briefing:** 30 minutes
 - o **Installation Work:** 3 hours
 - o **Testing & Judging:** 1 hour
5. **Rules During the Contest**
 - o All work must be done on-site during the competition period.
 - o Participants must follow **Philippine Electrical Code (PEC)** standards.
 - o All wirings must be neatly arranged and securely fastened.
 - o Unsafe practices may lead to point deduction or disqualification.
6. **Safety Requirements**
 - o Participants must wear **complete PPE:** hard hat, safety shoes, gloves, and safety glasses.
 - o No live testing is allowed until approved by the judges or technical committee.
7. **Originality & Work Quality**
 - o The output must follow the given layout while demonstrating craftsmanship and proper workmanship.
 - o Judges will inspect neatness, accuracy, and safety compliance.
8. **Ownership of Output**
 - o All installed work and materials will remain the property of the organizer.

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Tech-Voc Extension Wire Making Competition

Theme: " *Beyond the Classroom: Tech-Voc for a Thriving Community*"

I. Participants

1. Open to **elementary pupils** from participating schools in the Division of Sagay City.
2. Each school may send **one (1) official representative**.
3. Participants must be bona fide pupils officially enrolled in their respective schools.

II. Scope of Competition

1. Participants will assemble a **functional extension wire** following proper electrical installation procedures.
2. The finished product must be **safe, neat, and functional**.

III. Materials and Equipment

Provided by Organizers:

- Tables or work area for each participant
- Electrical outlet for product testing
- Certificates and score sheets for judging

Brought by Participants (Mandatory):

- All required materials:
 - Electrical wire (specified length)
 - Male and female plug/receptacle
 - Junction box (if applicable)
 - Electrical tape, screws, and other needed components
- Tools: screwdrivers, pliers, wire stripper, etc.
- PPE: apron, gloves, safety goggles

Note: Participants are responsible for ensuring all materials and tools are safe, functional, and in compliance with the competition's safety standards.

IV. Competition Mechanics

1. Each participant will be given **2 hours** to assemble their extension wire.
2. Work must comply with **basic electrical safety codes**.
3. Finished product will be tested by judges for:
 - Functionality (proper connection, no short circuit)
 - Safety (secure insulation, proper wiring)
4. Participants must observe proper use of PPE and tools at all times.
5. Any participant who violates safety protocols will be disqualified.

V. Criteria for Judging

Neatness & Workmanship – Orderly arrangement, clean finish	30%
Accuracy – Proper wiring according to standard procedure	20%
Time Management – Completed within given time	10%

VI. Decision Finality

- Judges' decisions are **final and irrevocable**.



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Tech-Voc Short Film Making Contest

Theme: " *Beyond the Classroom: Tech-Voc for a Thriving Community*"

Mechanics

1. Participants

- Each school may submit **one (1) official entry**.
- Participants must be **bona fide students** of the Division of Sagay City.
- Entries may be created by a **team of up to 10 members**.

2. Film Content

- The short film must align with the **National Tech-Voc 2025 theme and subtheme**.
- It should highlight the role of technical-vocational education in empowering Filipinos with skills and opportunities for employment and a better future.
- Content must be **original, wholesome**, and suitable for general audiences.

3. Technical Specifications

- Running time: **4 to 6 minutes**, including opening and closing credits.
- Format: **MP4** (1080p recommended).
- Language: Any, but non-English/Filipino dialogues must have English subtitles.

4. Submission Guidelines

- Entries must be submitted via **USB** or through an official **Google Drive link** provided by the organizers.
- File naming format:

SchoolName_TeamLeaderName_TechVoc2025
Example: SagayNHS_JuanDelaCruz_TechVoc2025

- Deadline for submission: **August 22, 2025**. Late submissions will not be accepted.

5. Production Rules

- Use of copyrighted music, video, or images without permission is prohibited.
- AI-generated visuals or scripts may be used only if substantially modified and credited.
- Scenes must be shot and edited by the participants themselves—no professional production companies allowed.

6. Judging & Screening

- All entries will be screened and judged based on the set criteria.
- Winning entries will be featured during the Tech-Voc Month Culmination Program.

7. Ownership & Rights

- All submitted films become the property of the Schools Division Office and may be used for advocacy, educational, or promotional purposes.

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Tech-Voc Bangus Deboning

Theme: " *Beyond the Classroom: Tech-Voc for a Thriving Community*"

Mechanics

1. Eligibility

- Open to **AFA senior high school students** from participating schools in the Division of Sagay City.
- Each school may send **only one (1) official representative**.

2. Scope of Competition

- Participants will perform **both deboning and frying of bangus**.
- Finished product should be **ready-to-serve fried boneless bangus** with good taste, texture, and presentation.

3. Materials and Equipment

- **Provided by Organizers:**
 - One (1) fresh bangus (500–700g)
 - Cooking stove and fuel
 - Cooking oil
 - Seasoning ingredients (salt, pepper, vinegar)
 - Apron, disposable gloves, hair net, and face mask
- **Brought by Participants:**
 - Deboning tools (knife, tweezers/pliers)
 - Small basin for washing fish
 - Chopping board
 - Tongs, frying pan (optional if preferred), and utensils
 - Clean cloth or paper towels

4. Competition Flow

- a. Participants will be given their fresh *bangus* at the start signal.
- b. They must debone the fish completely, keeping the flesh intact.
- c. They may season the fish using provided ingredients only.
- d. Fish must be fried to golden brown, with crisp skin and tender meat.
- e. Finished product should be plated neatly for presentation to the judges.

5. Time Limit

- **Maximum total time:** 2 hours (30 minutes for deboning, 1 hour and 30 minutes for marinating, frying and plating).

6. Hygiene and Safety

- Participants must observe proper food handling and sanitation at all times.
- Wearing of apron, gloves, hair net, and face mask is mandatory.
- Unsafe practices or handling will result in point deductions or disqualification.

7. Criteria for Judging

Criteria	Percentage
Bone Removal Completeness – No pin bones, intact flesh	25%
Cooking Quality – Taste, doneness, texture	25%
Neatness & Presentation – Appearance, plating, cleanliness	25%
Speed & Efficiency – Work pace without sacrificing quality	15%
Hygiene & Safety – Sanitation and safe cooking practices	10%
Total	100%



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8. **Tiebreaker**

- In case of a tie, the participant with the **highest cooking quality score** will be declared the winner.

9. **Finality of Results**

- Judges' decisions are **final and irrevocable**.



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Tech-Voc Innovative Dish (Vegetable and Meat Categories) Competition

Theme: " *Beyond the Classroom: Tech-Voc for a Thriving Community*"

Mechanics

I. Participants

1. The competition is **open to all TVL senior high school students** from participating schools in the Division of Sagay City.
2. There will be **two (2) categories**:
 - o **Vegetable Dish** – Dish must have at least **70% vegetable content**.
 - o **Meat Dish** – Dish must have at least **60% meat content** (pork, beef, or poultry).
3. Each school may send **two (2) participants per category**.

II. Dish Requirements

1. Dish must be **original and innovative**, showing creativity in flavor, presentation, and use of ingredients.
2. Recipe should incorporate **local, seasonal, and sustainable ingredients** where possible.
3. Dishes must be prepared **on-site** during the competition.
4. **Pre-cooked ingredients** are not allowed, except for items requiring long marination (must be declared to the organizers before the start).
5. Dish must be plated for **three (3) servings**:
 - o **One (1)** for display and visual evaluation
 - o **Two (2)** for tasting by the judges

III. Time Allocation

- **Total Cooking Time: 2 hours** (includes preparation, cooking, and plating)
- **Dish Presentation Time: 5 minutes** after cooking ends

IV. Materials and Equipment

Brought by Participants (Mandatory):

- Cooking station/equipment (stove with fuel source, portable burner, or induction cooker)
- Cooking utensils, knives, chopping boards, and all necessary tools for preparation
- Main ingredients, condiments, and garnishes (must be edible)
- Plates and materials for final plating and presentation
- Apron, disposable gloves, hair net, and face mask
- Additional plating accessories (optional)

V. Hygiene and Food Safety

1. Wearing of apron, gloves, hair net, and face mask is **mandatory** during the entire competition.
2. All ingredients must be fresh, clean, and safe for consumption.
3. Cooking and preparation areas must be kept clean and organized.
4. Unsafe food handling will result in **point deductions** or disqualification.





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VI. Judging Criteria

Hygiene & Food Safety – Cleanliness, PPE use, safe handling	10%

VII. Tiebreaker Rule

- In case of a tie, the **highest Taste & Texture score** will determine the winner.

VIII. Awards

- Champion, 1st Runner-Up, and 2nd Runner-Up** per category
- Certificates of participation for all contestants

IX. Decision Finality

- All decisions of the judges are **final and irrevocable**.



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Tech-Voc District Bazaar Expo

Theme: " *Beyond the Classroom: Tech-Voc for a Thriving Community*"

Mechanics

I. Participants

1. Each district (Districts 1–10) must have **one (1) official display booth** for the bazaar.
2. The booth must represent the district’s schools and showcase TVL skills, products, and services.

II. Display Guidelines

1. Each booth should highlight **Tech-Voc related products and services**, which may include:
 - o Food and beverages
 - o Handicrafts, souvenirs, or clothing
 - o Agricultural, fishery, or home economics products
 - o Technical or service demonstrations (e.g., hair cutting, gadget repair, welding items)
2. Displays must be **authentic, student-produced, and school-approved**.
3. Each booth must have:
 - o A **district banner** indicating district number and school names
 - o Price tags for all items on sale
 - o A clean, safe, and organized setup
4. Selling prices should be **reasonable** to encourage participation and sales.
5. Booths must be manned by **students and one teacher-coordinator** at all times.

III. Logistics

1. Booth setup time: **August 25, 2025, from 6:00 AM to 8:00 AM**.
2. Bazaar official opening: **8:30 AM** after ribbon cutting.
3. Closing time: **4:00 PM**; booths must be cleared by **5:00 PM**.
4. Each district is responsible for:
 - o Bringing their own tables, chairs, and display materials
 - o Decorating and arranging their booth
 - o Ensuring waste is disposed of properly

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Tech-Voc BPP Cake Baking and Design Contest

Theme: " *Beyond the Classroom: Tech-Voc for a Thriving Community*"

Participants:

- Open to Secondary students enrolled in TLE – BPP (Bread and Pastry Production).
- Team of two participates only.
- 2. **Contest Output:**
 - Each participant must **bake and design** a 1 layer cake with mold size 6-inch single round cake.
 - **Both baking and decorating** will be done during the contest period.
- 3. **Time Allotment:**
 - Total contest time: **3 to 4 hours**
- 4. **Ingredients & Materials:**
 - Participants must bring their own ingredients (flour, eggs, butter, etc.) and decorating tools (e.g., piping bags, spatulas).
 - Use of **commercial pre-mixes is not allowed.**
 - All **decorations must be edible.**
- 5. **Equipment:**
 - Oven and mixer will be provided by the participants.
- 6. **Safety & Cleanliness:**
 - Food safety and proper sanitation must be observed at all times.
 - Workstation must be clean and orderly before, during, and after the contest.
- 7. **Final Presentation:**
 - Cake must be presented on a cake board or plate.
 - Neatness and creativity in plating are part of the judging.
